

## The North Lamar Combined Neighborhood Planning Area

Land Use Workshop I, February 3, 2009 Meeting Notes

The purpose of the workshop was to identify/determine areas of possible change within the NLCNPA. The Land Use Workshop I began with a recap of the Mid-Process Open House and was followed by a brief presentation by Mark Walters in which he provided meeting attendees with an example of the exercise which was to follow. Meeting attendees split into two groups for the exercise. Group members were to identify areas within their neighborhood that should see particular levels of change. Those levels of change were:

- Areas not likely to change -- areas that aren't expected to change for the foreseeable future (20-30 years). No investment needed except for maintenance.
- Areas with some change likely -- areas that should undergo minor changes, but will substantively remain the same. Minor improvements will be made on an as-needed basis.
- Areas of moderate change -- areas that should go through major changes such as demolitions, major remodeling. Sites for redevelopment should also be identified.
- Areas of significant change -- areas that are inappropriate for their location, underutilized, deteriorated, or vacant. Areas that should be considered for new, significant redevelopment.

Two "Areas of Changes" maps were developed; the maps and their associated notes can also be found on the NLCNPA website. The map legend is as follows:

Level of Change	Color
Areas not likely to change	Green
Areas with some change likely	Yellow
Areas of moderate change	Orange
Areas of significant change	Red
